urus at O₂ shops in Yorkshire and Nottinghamshire have been helping transform the lives of visually impaired people, thanks to an initiative called Project iCare.

The scheme helps blind and partially sighted people make the most of their smartphones and other tech, with specialist advice from O₂ Gurus.

"Many features we recommend, such as voiceover tools and screen enlargers, are already built into the phones," explains Project iCare

organiser Mark Skelton. "They're not always obvious - but once demonstrated, they can really help." Mark was assistant manager at an O₂ shop for six years until he lost 80% of his vision three years ago.

SPECIALIST TRAINING

"It was a huge thing, losing my sight," explains Mark. "Over 60% of registered blind people are unemployed - I thought I'd lose my job."

Instead, Mark was soon launching

Project iCare, training O₂ Gurus to support visually impaired customers with the help and advice they need.

It's in-depth stuff – at one point, O_2 Gurus are led blindfolded around Leeds city centre, to help them understand the difficulties visualy impaired people face.

"Everyone is different. There's no 'one size fits all' solution," adds Mark. "It's about finding out a person's level of sight, and listening to what works for them. We concentrate on a person's capabilities, not their disability."

MAKE IT TOUGH
